# Introducing PC Ryan Day

#### A little bit about me

I began my career in December of 2000 at the ripe old age of 20. The last 19 years, I have been based mainly in the South Gloucestershire area with some time being spent in the city of Bath. My last 4 years have been spent working for the Investigations Department (CID for us older ones) investigating serious and organised crime. I love all things active and I have a passion for food and motorcycle restoration.



# Why does the City Academy need a full time Police Officer?

Some of you may be surprised to hear that the role of the Schools Prevention and Engagement Officer is not a new one. My predecessor, PC Parsons, retired from the role a number of years back and since that time the role has not been permanently filled. City Academy is one of several schools across the City that are fortunate enough to have its very own inhouse officer.

It is widely accepted that over time, having an officer based within a school setting is beneficial to the welfare and education of its students.

#### My Role and why I applied ....

My role now is predominately based around engagement and the prevention of crime. My working day starts at 7am when I share breakfast and stories with students in the Venue. This is what I would consider quiet time where students gently flow into school. Throughout the day, I work closely with the Academy's safeguarding team, teachers and students, gathering information and identifying any immediate concerns.

At around 3pm, I leave the premises and position myself outside of the main entrance of the school. This gives me chance to talk to parents and guardians before the main gates are opened. After a brief walk around the local area, I head back to finish my reports and create actions for the following day.

I soon hope to start delivering presentations and educational inputs around a variety of topics including online safety, weapons, and drugs amongst others.

In time, I hope to be involved in various extracurricular actives such as sports and social clubs, I feel it is important to continue engagement outside of my uniformed role.

People ask me why I would want to give up the glitz and glamour of serious crime to become a Schools Officer. My reply is simply that prosecution and punishment alone is not enough. I feel education and engagement at a young age is imperative in order to give young people the tools they need to successfully navigate a sometimes-difficult path to adulthood.

I would love to meet as many parents and guardians as possible throughout the year and will be making regular appearances at parents' evenings, so please come and talk to me then, or after school at the school gates.

# **ESOL** Adult Education

We run ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) courses for adults. Our classes are at different levels, from Pre-Entry to Level 1 and are taught by qualified, experienced tutors.

Ofsted recently inspected the City of Bristol College, and the Adult Learning Programme received a grading of 'Good' which is where our ESOL provision sits. Verbal feedback from the inspector who visited one of our classes as part of the ESOL 'deep dive' was that he was "very impressed with what he saw".

From the report: "The college makes good use of community learning centres to introduce potential students to learning. Adult students highlight how they gain in confidence from working in such supportive environments."
