Exam Results

This summer our students, parents and staff at City Academy had every reason to celebrate their best GCSE results ever. Despite national results being lower than the previous year, all of their key trends were upwards.



Pupils overall made progress above the National Average from Key Stage 2 (Year 6) to Key Stage 4 (GCSEs), with an average Progress 8 score of 0.41. 59% of students achieved a grade 9-4 in English and Maths (which are like the old A* to C and considered to be a passes), which is up 9% from last year. 36% of students achieved a grade 9-5 in English and Maths (this is equivalent to A* - B and enables them to go on to do A levels of their choice), which is up 13% from last year.

The Maths Department is particularly strong, and teachers come from other schools to see best practice and how we manage to achieve year on year success. This year we also achieved our best English results ever.

Results were particularly high for our Somali students at City Academy this year. 81% of Somali students achieved 9-4 grades in Maths and English and 52% of Somali students got the excellent results of 9-5 (A*-B). The progress they made from primary school was an incredible 1.21 that is over a grade better than the national average.

Revealed at the Tobacco Factory

32 GCSE Drama and Performing Arts students went to see Revealed at the Tobacco Factory it was a powerful and engaging play that explores a range of themes including masculinity, racism and homophobia. After the show students had the opportunity to ask the actors and writers questions about the play. They have all been inspired by seeing it.

Levi Roots Visit

At the end of September, Levi Roots, Chair of the Board for St Paul's Carnival and famous for his Reggae Reggae Sauce, came to visit Year 8 students for a motivational assembly. Students really enjoyed meeting him.



School of Sanctuary Status

City Academy also applied to have its School of Sanctuary status reaccredited, (as it was the first secondary school in the city to get the award a decade ago), and they were successful. This means they have been judged to be safe and welcoming for newly arrived pupils, particularly those who do not have good levels of English or are seeking sanctuary, and that all the pupils are aware of the issues facing asylum seekers and refugees and are happy to support them.

The Principal, Ben Tucker, and Family Support Manager, Azmina Mitha, were asked to showcase this work at the University of Bristol's Wills Building, at an event to celebrate City of Sanctuary with the Mayor and Lord Mayor.

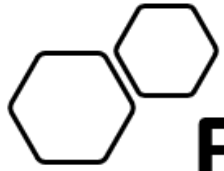
